Findings (Libya & Terrorism)

- **1. Longstanding support** by Libyan regime/Qaddafi (1969-2011) for terrorism.
- 2. Terrorism mobilized as **predominant foreign policy**.
- **3. Militarized, internationalized** regional conflicts in Africa (Chad, Sudan, Uganda, Egypt).
- 4. Global hub for **public support** for paramilitary groups espousing political use of violence (IRA, US Black Power, militant Palestinian splinter groups, guerillas in Philippines, Ethiopia, Somalia, Yemen, Chad, Morocco, Tunisia, Thailand, Panama)
- 5. Patronage contributes to post-1970s **upsurge in transnational terrorism.**
- 6. Contrary to others, where terrorism is unintended byproduct of group activities, Qaddafi deliberately promotes terrorist violence via financial and logistics support to extremists in order to exert political influence.





Libyan regime provides insurgency training, logistical, and funding support to Foday Sankoh, leader and co-founder (with Charles Taylor) of Sierra Leone rebel group Revolutionary United Front (RUF), as part of Qadhafi's sponsoring of revolutionary movements throughout the world and interventions in Africa. After Sankoh leeaves Libya for Liberia, joining forces with Charles Taylor, and under RUF auspices, he commits documented atrocities against the Liberian population into the 1990s, backed by support and direction from Qadhafi, who routinely meets with Taylor and associates to review progress in their "scorched-earth campaigns" (including mass rapes and amputations) and to supply weapons. Sankoh was indicted on 17 counts for various war crimes (use of child soldiers) and crimes against humanity (including extermination, enslavement, rape, and sexual slavery).

July – ANO operatives attack a Greek cruise ship, The City of Poros, killing 9 and wounding over 100 people. Libya provides the weapons used in the attack.¹⁷²

December 21 – A bomb hidden in stored luggage explodes on board Pan Am Flight 103, killing 259 people on board and 11 people on the ground in Lockerbie, Scotland. After two years of investigations, the evidence implicates two Libyan government agents, Abdelbaset Ali Mohmed al Megrahi and Al Amin Khalifa Fhimah. In November 1991 the U.S. and British government charge the agents, asking for their extradition. On 31 January 2001, Megrahi is found guilty of murder and sentenced to life in prison (his co-defendant was found not guilty and released). Qadhafi admitted responsibility for the attack in 2003 and paid more than \$2.7 billion to families of the victims. 174





Hot Spots: Presence of well-organized terrorist groups (correspondence with map of Middle East and North Africa)






Hot Spots: The spread of Islamic State...






Foreign Terrorist Fighters: Flows into the Levant (ICSR-Soufan 2014)

Data-Driven Global Indicators: Phases of Terror

- 1. Traditional Terrorism: 19th century (The Anarchists)—state officials as targets
- Modern Terrorism: Cold War behavior nation states and proxy wars/armies
- 3. Postmodern Terrorism: Gray zone conflict and campaigns—and the "new normal" ...
 - Leveraging global issues: Migration & migration crisis
 - Global insecurity: Rise of religious persecution (across all sects), identity regimes, tribalisms
 - Exacerbation of existing governance challenges: Development, corruption, institutions, inclusivity, equity, climate/water wars
